Instruction

342.1 - Programs for Students with Disabilities

The Green Lake School Board of Education shall provide a free, appropriate public education to all eligible disabled persons ages three (3) through twenty-one (21) which complies with Federal and State laws and guidelines.

The Board further embraces the State and Federal requirement that a continuum of alternative placements be available to meet the needs of children with disabilities eligible for special education under the state and federal laws.

A special education handbook shall be developed for use in the District that outlines specific policies and procedures relating to children with disabilities. The handbook shall meet legal requirements.

Within the parameters of state and federal laws governing the operation of programs for students with disabilities, there are due process safeguards for parent rights and procedures for making an appeal.

The Green Lake School District shall identify and screen children residing in the District for possible special education needs in accordance with established procedures.

An appropriate Individual Education Plan (IEP) team will be formed for each initial referral, placement, and reevaluation. This program will be administered under the direction of a special education director for the district.

The District shall complete all special education reports as required by the Department of Public Instruction.
