## 370 - Extra-Curricular Activities and Programs

The Green Lake School District recognizes that participation in extracurricular activities enhances the educational experience. Students are encouraged to participate and excel in such activities, while giving their academic work the priority it deserves. Full participation means fair and equal participation to the extent that the budget, facilities, or type of activity allows.

Participation in extracurricular activities shall be in accordance with the standards and requirements set forth in the Activities Code and consistent with rules of related state activity associations, including the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletics Association. The Activities Code will be reviewed annually by the athletic director, activities committee, and 6-12 principal. Any significant changes will be presented to the policy committee prior to the May policy committee meeting. The coaches and advisors of the activities, the school administration and the Board of Education shall be responsible for enforcing the Activities Code.

All students, in grades 6-12, that participate in extra-curricular activities are required to attend a meeting before participating in such school activities at which the details of the Activities Code will be explained. A copy of the Activities Code will be provided to all 6-12 student participants in extra-curricular activities and the student and his/her parent/guardian will be required to acknowledge receipt of the Code. A copy of the Code will also be posted on the school's website.

The District shall not discriminate in admission to or participation in any program or activity, standards and rules of behavior, disciplinary actions or facilities usage on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. This policy does not, however, prohibit the district from placing a student in a program or an activity based on objective standards of individual performance, from providing separate programs in interscholastic activities for males and females if such programs are comparable in type, scope and support from the District, or from providing separate toilet, locker and shower facilities if they are comparable. Discrimination complaints shall be handled in accordance with established procedures.
