443 – Student Code of Conduct and Discipline

There is a strong commitment in the Green Lake School District to create and maintain an environment conducive to learning under the best circumstances possible. Students expect and have the right to a high quality educational program and learning environment. It is also expected that they demonstrate good faith in upholding the board approved Code of Conduct.

The provisions of the code apply in the following areas students are involved:

- 1) classrooms/all school property,
- 2) travel on school busses,
- 3) off-site school sponsored activities, and
- 4) on or off-site behavior that causes a disruption in the school.

All employees of the District shall share responsibility for supervising the behavior of students and for seeing that they comply with District policies, student conduct rules established by the building principal, and the code of classroom conduct adopted by the School Board. Students shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action for failure to comply. In addition, failure to abide by the code of classroom conduct may result in a variety of actions which include: removal from the classroom, discipline referral to the principal, detention, verbal reprimand, parent notification/conference, suspension, citation, and expulsion.

Each student has the right to appeal whenever he/she believes discipline regarding the code or other rules has been wrongfully applied.

The District shall not discriminate in standards and rules of behavior, on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be handled in accordance with established procedures.
